Professor Glen Kreiner (Penn State) Doing Grounded Theory: Advice from the Trenches



Workshop Summary: Professor Glen Kreiner will explore the main principles and processes behind grounded theory (the most widely used qualitative method in top-tier management journals). He will share experiences from his research projects, including insights on interviewing, coding data, memoing, and creating a grounded theory. Having served on the editorial boards for Administrative Science Quarterly, Academy of Management Journal, and Organization Science, he regularly reviews qualitative manuscripts and will share insights into that process as well.

Speaker Bio: Professor Glen Kreiner (Ph.D. Arizona State University) serves - or has served - on the editorial boards of the Academy of Management Review, the Academy of Management Journal, Administrative Science Quarterly, and Organization Science. He has published conceptual, quantitative, and qualitative work, with a special emphasis on using grounded theory, in several journals, including the Academy of Management Review, the Academy of Management Journal, Organization Science, and Organizational Behavior & Human Decision Processes. His research areas include identity work for individual, professional, and organizational identity, role transitions, dirty work & stigma, emotions in the workplace, and work-family negotiation. Glen is currently studying the experiences of persons with disabilities in the workplace and the policies and practices that might facilitate such experiences.
